

BEFORE GOING ON HOLIDAY

- Contact local law enforcement authorities to tell them that you are going on a holiday;
- Try to make it look like someone is home;
- Do not publicly state that you will be away from home;
- Ensure all doors and windows are closed and locked;
- Install an intrusion alarm;
- Avoid the overflowing mailbox;
- Make a list of your valuables and write down the serial numbers;
- If possible, leave for holiday during off-peak periods of the day;
- Ask a friend or trusted neighbour to check in occasionally;
- Leave your valuables in a safe place.

SAFE TOURISM PROGRAM

IN THE HOTEL

- Never leave your luggage unattended in public areas;
- Keep valuables in your hotel room safe;
- Make sure doors and windows are closed and locked when leaving the room;
- Lock all pieces of luggage.

WALKING

- Do not carry large amounts of cash;
- Carry your purse or wallet safely;
- Hand carry important documents or keep them in money belt;
- Plan your route carefully, travel on main streets, and use map;
- Avoid walking on dark alleys;
- Keep valuables within sight.

DRIVING

- Park in well-lit areas;
- Keep valuables out of sight;
- Do not block others when parking;
- Lock all doors and windows.

RESTAURANTS AND OTHER ESTABLISHMENTS

- Keep your purse or wallet in front of you and always in sight;
- Never lose sight of your bank cards during payment transactions.

ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT

- Pay special attention to entrances and exits;
- Keep valuables close to you and out of sight.

ON THE BEACH

- If possible, avoid carrying valuables;
- If going for a swim, choose a spot where you can keep an eye on your belongings.

DURING A ROBBERY

- Stay calm, quiet and in control of yourself;
- Do not fight the robber or offer resistance;
- Take note of as many details as possible, namely height, weight, clothes or any other distinguishing aspects.

AFTER A ROBBERY

- Contact law enforcement authorities to report the situation immediately after the robber leaves;
- Use the police report to request new documents.
